Purposes of the visit To discuss with Japanese and international academics on the issues of the future of Thai politics and give a presentation on Thailand's two draft constitutions. I also hope to explore a possibility of research collaboration and get acquaintance with the academic environment at Kyoto University.

The debate was very stimulating with a lot of good questions from the participants 3) After the session, I had an opportunity to exchange ideas with Assistant Professor Saya Kiba from Doshisha University, Faculty of Policy Studies, Dr. Adam Simpson from University of South Australia and Professor Yoko Yoshikawa, former professor of Nanzan University 4) Additionally, I had a chance to meet with ASAFAS's Ph.D. students who are currently writing dissertations on different issues about Thailand.
