There were 2 students from the Department of Global Health and Socio-epidemiology during the morning session of Jan 31. One of the students was from University of Malaya (Malaysia) who is under the UM-KU double degree on public health programme - Ms. Amir Hamzah Nurul Syafika. Her thesis title was 'Psychological Stress among Southeast Asian Students in Japan: A Qualitative Study (please see the attached pictures). I observed that the students gain a lot of experiences from this event. It is not only the knowledge that they gain from professors and experts, but also how to be professional presenters. It is a best practice example, which I would like to adapt this idea to Mahidol University.

This visit has strengthened a collaboration between Kyoto University and Mahidol University. We are committed to publish articles in international journals and continue to exchange lecturers and students. It is such a useful and successful visit.
