Place of fieldwork: France

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Research background

People in Asia and Africa have invented many utensils and tools that are used on a daily basis to adapt to the natural environment, enhance social relationships in communities, and influence the outside world. This research contributes to the development of a sustainable human sphere in Asia and Africa by describing the process by which local knowledge (*ZAIRAICHI*) related specifically to the body and bodily techniques, the domain that is most vulnerable to changes in global conditions and social institutions, is shared and disseminated.

Research purpose and aim

The focus of this research includes the following three components: 1) fieldwork in Southwestern Ethiopia; 2) academic collaboration with the South Omo Research Center and Museum (SORC&M) at Addis Ababa University as well as with local communities, such as the South Omo People's Ensete Research Center (SOPERC); and 3) academic exchanges related to the results of my research at international conferences. This year, I will focus on the second and third components.

• Results and achievements by fieldwork

I presented an international workshop from May 11 to May 19, 2013, called 'Out of culture: the society by its wastes, Marseille France.' The organizers were Dr. Frédéric Joulian, Associate Professor EHESS, and Dr. Agnès Jeanjean of Nice University. I joined this workshop to carry out the third aim of this research this year, and I obtained information on how an academic institution such as EHESS can contribute their research results to a community in France.

• Implications and impacts on future research

Because most participants at this international workshop are interested in the topic of material culture and object techniques, it was a positive experience to exchange ideas on issues of the waste process, which was another aspect of my presentation for continuing this research on the *ZAIRAICHI* concept. In addition, it was a good chance to have all of the research history of techniques in *Technique and Culture* from the 1970s to 2010. This research needs to include research history to elucidate the core concept of this research.
