

## The 10th Kyoto University Southeast Asia Forum 2012

### Rationale

Recently numerous water disaster have devastated many regions of the world in rapid successions: Japan, China, Philippines, Vietnam and Thailand etc. Last year, Fukushima Tsunami and Bangkok 2011 Floods were samples of such frequent and serious disasters occurred.

Not only heavy physical damages (water gates, dyke, building, public infrastructure and industries etc.) are common-place in a severe water disaster but a multitude of people (regardless of ages, genders, professions, social statuses) also lose their lives or are maimed, suffering serious injury.

The questions are what we can learn from these:

- What is the probability of a big floods occurring in Thailand, including Bangkok, within the next 10 years?
- If and when such a big floods occurs in or near Bangkok, what areas are prone to be attacked? What might be the magnitude and scale of socioeconomical casualties (deaths and serious injury) from residences and industries of all sizes?
- What about the functions of large dams or water reservoirs located nation-wide?
- Smart people learn from their experiences; the wise learn from the experiences of others. What are the main lessons we should learn from the various floods in the past?
- What to do and not to do when we encounter a floods again?
- Experiences from Japan can help mitigate the floods events ?
