My dissertation deals with Indonesian labour movement of the 1945-1950 period. It describes the formation and development of state-labour relationship in Indonesia for a historical perspective, by examining how workers had formed and structured their organisations during the years of 1945-1948, the very peak of Indonesian revolutionary period. From my dissertation work, I would like to take up a longer time frame by extending it from 1950 to 1965, and particularly on two specific issues: on women workers, and on the Chinese workers in the colony. I would need to consult more archives for that purpose so that I can integrate it within the study. The library research is to compile necessary archives from various libraries, including the National Archives at The Hague, and the KITLV library at Leiden.

Research Achievement on this Program (300~400 Words)

The library research has gathered materials and archives from the National Archives at The Hague, and the KITLV library at Leiden. It has copies of related documents, magazine, and books from the period of 1945-1950. They serve as primary sources for the study. In addition to that, some books as secondary sources for the study are purchased. The materials are gathered as to the circumstances they are available in the Netherlands and well organized to ease further research. In all the materials are important for my study as to add more data and comprehensive understanding on the subject. I would donate most of the materials to the vernacular collections of CSEAS library upon the completion of this study. During my time in the Netherlands, I have also made some new contacts, met and interviewed two persons on the subject of my study.
