The research is focusing on the state of Indonesian labour unions after the Reformasi 1998. The Reformasi has brought enormous change in the						
socio-political environment of the state-labour relationship that allows more rooms for workers to organise and join into unions. However, it has also						
delivered neo-liberal challenges for workers' collective effort to defend their economic interests in the workplace. This two-side of the changes and						
challenges of the Reformasi shapes the popular debate on the possible roles of the labour unions in the contemporary politics.						
The fieldwork was intended to examine three related issues: 1) on the various kind of organising vehicles workers are taking up to level up their						
bargaining capacity against the neoliberal challenges, 2) on the roles of unions outside the conventional sphere of labour activism, and 3) on the						
political economy of labour unions' participation in everyday politics. One particular interest of the fieldwork is on workers activism at the industrial						
zone, Kawasan Berikat Nusantara (KBN), located in the northern part of Jakarta.
