Background

Lombok is an island in West Nusa Tenggara (Nusa Tenggara Barat or NTB) province, located between Bali and Sumba islands, Indonesia. It is roughly circular, with a "tail" (Sekotong Peninsula) to the southwest, about 70 km across and a total area of about 4,725 km² (1,825 sq mi). The provincial capital and largest city on the island is Mataram. It is somewhat similar in size and density with neighboring Bali and shares some cultural heritage, but is administratively part of NTB along with sparsely populated Sumbawa. The island is home to some 3.16 million Indonesians. Lombok is often marketed as "an unspoiled Bali," or "Bali's sister island". Currently with support of the central government Lombok and Sumbawa are being developed as Indonesia 2nd destination for international and domestic tourism. Lombok has retained a more natural, uncrowded and undeveloped environment, which attract travelers who come to enjoy its relaxed pace and the opportunity to explore the island's unspoiled, spectacular natural beauty.

Nusa Tenggara Barat and Lombok may be considered economically depressed by First World standards and a large majority of the population live in poverty. Still, the island is fertile, has sufficient rainfall in most areas for agriculture, and possesses a variety of climate zones. Consequently, food in abundant quantity and variety is available inexpensively at local farmer's markets, though locals still suffer from famine due to drought and subsistence farming. A family of 4 can eat rice, vegetables, and fruit for as little as US\$0.50. Even though a family's income may be as small as US\$1.00 per day from fishing or farming, many families are able to live a contented and productive life on such astonishingly small incomes. However, the people of Lombok are coming under increasing pressure from rising food and fuel prices. Access to housing, education and health services remains difficult for many of the island's indigenous population.

The main three sectors that support the welfare of Lombok people are maritime, agriculture and livestock farm. However, these natural resources are not fully utilized due to the poor knowledge of the Lombok people. Therefore, herein this meeting the HAKU delegations supported by Kyoto University, LIPI and University of Mataram will share potential innovation, technical and social approach on utilization of natural resources, especially in the sectors of maritime, agriculture and livestock farm to enhance Lombok people welfare, in particular, and to the broader society in Indonesia, Southeast Asia region and Japan.

Objectives

To learn and share potential innovation of technical and social approach on utilization of natural resources especially in the sectors of fisheries, agriculture and livestock farm to enhance people welfare in Lombok.
